

Go West! – Visitor attractions across the Western Lake District win top accolades

The high quality of visitor attractions across West Cumbria has been recognised with the area winning a host of top accolades in prestigious VisitEngland tourism awards.

Three venues have received VisitEngland Visitor Attraction Accolades - which celebrate excellence and recognise outstanding visitor experiences.







The winning attractions are:

- Muncaster Castle, Gardens, Hawk and Owl Centre at Ravenglass awarded a Best Told Story Accolade.
- The Beacon Museum at Whitehaven also receives a Best Told Story Accolade.
- The Lakes Distillery near Cockermouth wins a Gold Accolade for all round performance.

Nationally, 76 attractions are being recognised for the exceptional experiences they provide visitors. In the North West – four out of the eight winning attractions are in Cumbria. The Quaker Tapestry Museum in Kendal receives a Hidden Gem Accolade.

But the strong performance by attractions in the Western Lake District and Coast area has delighted those who've worked incredibly hard to provide top class visitor attractions.
